

# The Åland Islands or 6 564 islands with names


**Population 30 359 (2022)**

- 1917 Spring discussed their future
- 6 december 1917
- June 1919 Referendum
- Reunification with Sweden
- 1919 Paris
- George Clemenceau statement
- Finland offered Autonomy
- Security Question
- 1920 Geneva Britain referred League of Nations
- 1921 June three days



- 1. The Sovereignty of the Aaland islands is recognised to belong to Finland;
- 3. The..guarantees... should specially aim at the preservation of the Swedish language in the schools....
- 4. The Council has requested that the guarantees will be more likely to achieve their purpose, if they are discussed and agreed to by the Representatives of Finland with those of Sweden, if necessary with the assistance of the Council of the League of Nations.....

# The Swedish Language

- Part of Finland with as extensive autonomy as possible without becoming an independent state
- The Swedish language and culture would forever be guaranteed.
- Not Assimilation Not Integration
- Finland a bilingual state
- Only schools where the language of tuition is Swedish
- The Islands should be Demilitarised and Neutralised

## European Union – Åland Protocol

- Could have remained outside the EU
- The Guarantees from Geneva Accepted by the EU
- Have no representation in the EP
- Competence Leakage
- Outside the Tax-union
- Transformed from Linguistic protection to playing a role
